The <u>History of Polo on Kaua'i</u> begins with a review of polo's roots, early play in Hawaii, polo players and polo associations, and inter-island matches including Army teams from Oahu. It begins as early as the mid-1870s and develops across the islands during the 1880s.

The majority of the collection is focused on the development of the sport on Kaua'i with specific information about teams, matches, championships, and players up to 2007. Early photos show polo fields with horse and buggies lining the field. Audiences numbered about 2,000 folks, many watched from bleachers or found space along the field. Polo was played on multiple sites; an old sugar cane field, front yards of larger homes in Puhi and Hanalei, and the Waipouli Race Course. In 1924, the Ahukini Terminal and Railroad provided free train rides to the Waipouli location, carrying fans from Kipu, Huleia, Puhi, Lihue and Hanamaulu to one Armistice Day event. The last polo field on Kaua'i was at Anini across from the beachfront.

While most sports continue without interruption over the years, there were definite periods of inactivity for Kaua'i. Some of these gaps could be attributed to World Wars, others were due to lack of suitable polo fields. *The Garden Island Newspaper* served as the main resource for detailed information on Kaua'i polo matches and there were years with few or no games mentioned.

The author, Bette Layton, as the historian for the Kaua'i Polo Association, provided *The Garden Island Newspaper* written reviews of local polo activities – matches, development of additional activities by the Kaua'i Polo Association, and information on polo players. She also reported on matches played on other islands, on the mainland and even Europe. Her love of polo began with matches she attended in New York before leaving the East coast to relocate to Arizona and eventually to Kaua'i for more than a dozen years. Bette is the author of <u>The Golden Mallet</u>, which is available in online bookstores. Ms. Layton volunteered at the Kaua'i Historical Society while living here, archiving a number of manuscripts (ensuring availability to the Kaua'i community) and providing support for numerous activities and events.
