## Mayor Byan Baptiste – His Poetry

Three volumes in 1 box, 1 music CD

#### Abstract:

Bryan Baptiste served Kaua'i as a council member and as Mayor from 2002 until his death in 2008. He leaves behind 3 volumes of poetry, generously donated to the Kaua'i Historical Society, excerpts to be used in publications, for notecards, and projects.

### **History:**

Bryan J. Baptiste was born in Lihue, his father Anthony C. Baptiste Jr., served on the Kaua'i County Board of Supervisors (later known as the Kaua'i County Council).

Bryan Baptiste was the manager of the Kaua'i War Memorial; along with that he headed up the Island's Park Beautification Program. He was elected to a council seat in 1996. Baptiste made a successful run for mayor in 2002, a tight race against 2 other council members. Four years later he was re-elected. His second term as mayor, 2006 through 2010, was cut shor by a heart attack in 2008. Baptiste left behind a wife and four children.

Bryan's dedication to Kaua'i was acknowledged when Kapa'a New Town Park was renamed The Bryan Baptiste Sports Complex. The music CD entitled Mea Ho'omana'o (Aloha Begins with Me) is a special tribute to him.
